






Many of our programs are funded, though some do have user fees based on income. Links2Care transitioned our youth programs to the Town of Halton Hills as of July 2017. Links2Care received project-based funding of \$41,000 from the MHLHIN as startup funding for the acquisition of a new database system (Alayacare) that will be undertaken in the 2018-2019 fiscal year.







