We also expanded our Community Navigation, restructured our In-Home Services to a geographical model, and conceptualized an Enhanced Home Help program, all to better support our clients and front-line staff in this new normal.

Of course, client and staff health and safety has remained a key focus. We continued to respond to COVID-19 directives and guidelines, successfully implemented a Mandatory Vaccine Policy, and COVID Education and Antigen Testing Programs, and upgraded our Care Connections of Halton Hills site to enhance safety and accessibility.




